

Candy Wrapping Instructions – Full-Size (1.55 ounce) Candy Bars

Fits Hershey® Milk Chocolate and Nestle® Crunch Bars.

Step 1. Have wrappers, candy, and adhesive (glue stick, double-sided tape, or tape dispenser) ready and on-hand. Then, using scotch tape or double-sided tape, tape the two side flaps down tightly to the back of the candy bar as shown.

Note: If you are using foil -and paper -wrapped candy bars, or your candy bar does not have these flaps, you should omit this step.

Step 1A. FOR CUSTOMERS USING FOIL ONLY
- Omit this step if you are not using foil

Place the candy bar, face-down, in the middle of the rectangle of foil. Fold the sides of the foil up and over the candy bar first. Foil these up tight against the candy bar and hold them in place.

Fold the top flap, and then the bottom flap last. Pull all the flaps down and crease tightly. Tape is not necessary on the foil, but you can use it if desired - it will be wrapped over and not visible.

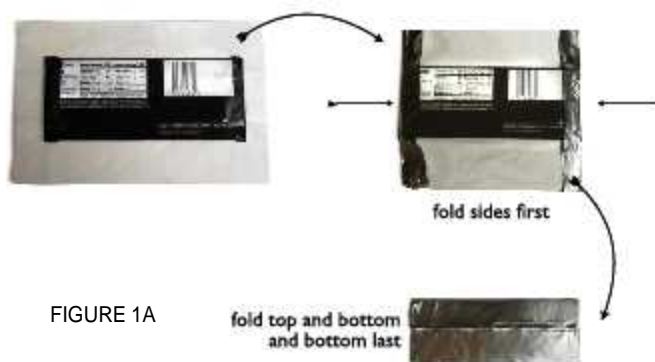

Step 2. Place the wrapper over the candy bar as shown. Then gently wrap the wrapper around the bar, by wrapping the top flap over first, and then the bottom over last. As you wrap, adjust the wrapper as necessary, to ensure it is in the correct position. Once you have the wrapper in the correct position, crease it slightly.

Step 3. Flip the bar over. Using the creases you made, fold the top flap down tightly. (This is the smaller flap with contact information on it.) Apply adhesive over the last 1/2" of the flap, or place a strip of double-sided tape across the entire flap as close to the edge as possible. You will be covering up the contact information with adhesive.

Step 4. Fold the larger, bottom flap up and press it into place over the adhesive. Pull this flap tight, to secure the wrapper onto the bar. It should not be able to be slid off the bar easily. If necessary, use your hands to adjust the position of the wrapper. Once it is in the final, correct position, gently crease it in place.
